Treasurer's Report

I know we are well and truly into the throes of Show Stoppers now, both mentally and physically, but I have now received all the income and expenditure receipts for Calamity Jane to finalise the show accounts which show a loss of £850. Very disappointingly audience numbers were well down on budget and on previous shows - almost by 30% from Sound of Music - reducing our income significantly. Costs were kept within budget in the main, with substantial sums being saved by utilising the School for most rehearsals rather than the Hall. Whilst we appreciate cast members and directors prefer to rehearse on the stage, we shall have to get used to using the School for the bulk of our rehearsals in future as the cost savings are so significant.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank Mr Peter Stubbs for his £100 donation to the society in memory of his parents, Joyce and Ron Stubbs, who were keen supporters of the Players for many years.

The society is always on the lookout for new patrons - if you are interested then please do let either Linda or me know. In addition, please could I remind you that membership subscriptions are due following the AGM on 25th June. Again, please send to Linda or myself.
