Treasurer's Report

As reported at the recent AGM it gives me great pleasure to announce a surplus for the financial year May 2014-April 2015 of £1664 which is quite an exceptional result. Both Showstoppers (2014) and Fiddler on the Roof generated a healthy surplus but not unexpectedly The Producers made a small loss. We have not had any major outgoings for the society over the past financial year which has boosted our surplus. The wardrobe costs for Fiddler on the Roof were very low indeed and for this I must thank Mary Lou Knox and Mary Coyte - Debbie Bowyer has worked exceptionally hard to raise advertising for the programmes over the past year and I would like to say a hearty thank you to her for all her hard work.

There are lots of other people behind the scenes who contribute to the success of the players throughout the year and a big thank you to all of you – you all know exactly who you are but special mention must be given to Vicki who really does work so hard to ensure the Players goes from strength to strength whilst many musical theatre groups around us are falling on hard times and sometimes having to disband completely. There has been talk of making changes to some of our fee policies recently but at the most recent committee meeting it was unanimously decided that the membership fee and show fee are very reasonable compared with other Societies our size and should stay as at present. Anybody wishing to audition for a part in one of our productions must be a fully paid up member of the society (£25 for a full year). In addition a quite separate show fee of £25 is due to cover the cost of each production and this is payable by both principal and chorus members of the production.

Show fees are now due for *How to Succeed in Business Without Really Trying* and can be paid to myself or Pamela Depledge at rehearsals. They can also be paid by BACS and Paypal. May I remind you that the fee will increase to £30 on 19th August and yes, I am back from my hols by then so this will be implemented!! No trying to sneak a crafty week or two more my friends!!! Still on the subject of trying to extract money from you all may I also remind you that membership subs are now due and I would be grateful if you could send them to Linda Donaldson our Membership Secretary. THROUGH THE AGES WITH THE HASLEMERE PLAYERS

50 YEARS AGO

In the year 1965 we only did one show and I have already included memories of "Die Fledermaus" performed in October. However in November that year, the D'Oyly Carte company (who produced all the Gilbert and Sullivan repertoire in the days before the copyright ran out) came to the Rex Cinema, Haslemere (where Rex Court now stands on the Liphook Road). They provided the four main soloists and the chorus was made up of members of Haslemere, Petersfield and Godalming Operatic Societies. There were two rehearsals in the week beforehand, we amateurs being taught by the professional MD, William Cox Iffe. The Rex was packed for the occasion and it was great singing along as part of the world-renowned company.

40 YEARS AGO

In August 1975 Haslemere Hall was the venue for the Silver Wedding party of Bill and Doreen Wylde, with members of the Players and Farnham and Alton companies getting together and enjoying country dancing and games as well as a delicious spread.

30 YEARS AGO

An EGM was called in March 1985 when the Council raised the rent at the Weaving House where we stored all our costumes. This was a building we shared with the Thespians and we had been paying just £60 a year, which was raised to £600! Members voted to levy a one-off charge of £5 on all members and at every rehearsal the cast were asked to put all their spare change in a giant bottle. At this time too Bill Cooper, our former chairman, died and money collected in his memory went towards new lighting at the Hall.

20 YEARS AGO


In May 1995 to commemorate the 50th anniversary of the end of World War II, the Players presented their own Music Hall tribute. The Hall bristled with Union Jacks, bunting and memorabilia and there was even a doodlebug wedged on the stage. The demand for tickets was so that once all the tables were filled, the overspill was relegated to the balcony with additional tables in the upstairs foyer. The tickets were in the form of ration books and programmes resembled military CO's orders. The audience joined in the ambience by dressing appropriately. There were plenty of rousing choruses and Hamish produced a puffing steam train for one of the sketches. For the finale everyone was dressed in red, white and blue and songs ranging from "We'll Meet Again" to "Rule Britannia" had the audience cheering and clapping and waving flags. And they were still in the Hall laughing and happy at 11.30 after which the poor waitresses had to clear away all the tables!

10 YEARS AGO

In May 2005 Don Stacey was director for the annual music hall. As it was the centenary of the first musical produced by the Players (in fact the company had unofficially started in 1899 doing plays and pantomimes under the same name) it was decided to reprise the most popular acts of the previous fifteen Music Halls. Thus some of the best sketches ever (including the hilarious "Chastity Belt" and "Pantomime Principal Boys") and some particularly spectacular musical numbers were reprised. The result was a real humdinger of a show.

June 25th was a night to remember as, on a balmy summer evening, Players of all ages gathered for a dazzling Centenary Ball at Cowdray Park Golf Club. It was a black tie affair, starting with a champagne reception, and followed by a dinner with tables decorated with individual themes of the many musicals produced by the company. A commemoration mug marked the place setting for each guest and it was a glittering evening enjoyed by everyone
