## TREASURER'S REPORT

I think everybody will agree that our autumn production – CHESS – was of a very high standard indeed. Because this is a high calibre show that is still put on relatively frequently by professional touring companies the royalties were quite a bit higher than normal and consequently, looking at the current figures, it is unlikely that the production will make a profit. However, I think it is very important that this does not detract from all the hard work that went into putting the show on, the very professional level of singing from the lead roles, the diligence of the wardrobe and scenery departments, both ensuring that our costs were kept to a minimum in those areas and the enjoyment that the cast had both during rehearsals and show week. Our tickets sales were not particularly adventurous which is disappointing given the outstanding critique that NODA gave the show. Despite its poor financial outlook I still think that everybody involved in CHESS should be very proud of the show they put on. Next up is The Gondoliers – we pay no royalties on this so can hopefully make a nice tidy profit to ensure I am able to give a cheery and upbeat report on the finances of the Haslemere Players at our AGM next summer!

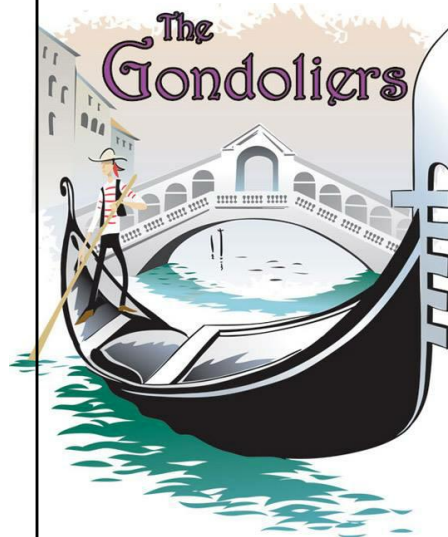
