Thanks to this great effort along with some shrewd cost control we made a strong profit on the show which when combined with some amazing results from our general Studio sales (costume hires/sales etc) means we are in with a fighting chance of breaking even for 2022/23! This is more than I could have hoped for only 6 months ago.

Maintaining momentum is what we need to do now. Showstoppers is often a good earner for us if it is well attended and then we have Calendar Girls at the end of the year which should sell very well. I have had a sneak preview of the shows for 2024 which are equally as exciting as the ones we have had this year, so all of the right factors are in place for us to continue to prosper.

Of course, we can't do anything without theatre bums on theatre seats, so I implore you to continue to support the society with your kind attendance at shows, social events and fund-raisers.

You will recall that we have a mountain to climb to raise funds for Project Studio 25 so maximising income is critical. With this in mind I will shamelessly say that general donations are always welcome too, and if you want something with a return on investment then for a generous donation I could be persuaded to dress in drag again! For an even bigger donation, I could be persuaded not to!!



Calendar Girls the Musical 24-28 October 2023

A funny, heart-warming musical, which like the 2003 film was based on a true story, *Calendar Girls the Musical* follows the story of best friends Annie and Chris, and the Knapely Women's Institute. Following the death of Annie's husband John, Chris wants to purchase a comfortable sofa for the visitors' lounge in the local hospital and to raise funds hits upon the idea of printing a WI calendar featuring their members discreetly posing nude. Written by Tim Firth with music and lyrics by Gary Barlow, this is a story about love, loss, friendship and community, and quintessentially British in its humour and feel.

Apparently, they were rehearsing lolanthe where Pam was a fairy with a very long spear-like wand. This got caught in Roger's costume while they were dancing and they were stuck together for the whole scene. They were married in 1953 at St. Christopher's Church here in Haslemere.

Pam has also received an email from Ted Thomson who is writing a family history and wondered if anyone had photos of the King and I in 1976.
